1. Wedding Forms and Fees

- ◆ Plan early so use of church space can be arranged without conflict at least 45 days before desired wedding date. A Wedding Application Form must be submitted to the church office for referral to Church Council who will in turn review church calendar for approval of desired date.
- ◆ Once notification is given by church office staff that the wedding date has been approved, a full payment will be required to confirm date on the church calendar. Payment should be made in full to Pleasant Grove Baptist Church during regular office hours. See Section 18 for fees.
- ◆ Damage deposit will be refunded within 30 days following the wedding date if all policies are adhered to.
- ◆ All remaining honorarium are due two weeks prior to Wedding Date to the appropriate parties. See Section 18 for suggested love gifts for those assisting with wedding service.
- ◆ All remaining forms are due two weeks prior to wedding or at time of consultation with Church Wedding Coordinator.
- ◆ Honor aria for services of soloists, sound technician, minister(s), musicians, food service hostess, photographers, florists, caterer or other persons contracted by the wedding party are the responsibility of the wedding party and should be paid directly to such persons. The church will not be liable for any such claims that may arise from such contracts.

2. Wedding and Rehearsal Times

- ◆ Weddings are not scheduled from Thanksgiving – January 1. Weddings are also not scheduled on Sundays, Wednesdays or for the holiday weekends of New Year, Thanksgiving, Fourth of July, Memorial Day, Christmas and Labor Day.
- ◆ Weddings with or without Church Receptions and Rehearsal Dinners are available.
- ◆ Time Frame that facilities are available for Wedding without Church Reception is usually 4 hours.
- ◆ Time Frame that facilities are available for Weddings with Church Reception is usually 6 hours.
- ◆ Rehearsals are generally scheduled the day before the Wedding Date.
- ◆ All members of the wedding party and the minister performing the ceremony need to be in attendance for the Rehearsal.
- ◆ Rehearsals usually last no longer than 2 hours. Rehearsals with a dinner usually last no longer than 3 hours.

3. Wedding Coordinator Responsibilities

- ◆ Assist Wedding Party with details of the Wedding, Rehearsal, and Reception to ensure that church property is used properly and respectfully. Also, to ensure that the wedding and rehearsal proceeds in a timely manner.
- ◆ The Church Wedding Coordinator is not responsible for securing musicians, photographers, florists, videographers, ministers or off-site receptions but is available for guidance with selection of professional services when requested by the Wedding Party.
- ◆ Church Wedding Coordinator must be present at consultation and any time the church facility is used by wedding party even if an outside wedding planner is employed. If there is a schedule

conflict at any time, the Church Wedding Coordinator may appoint a church member to assist (choosing another designated Church Wedding Coordinator first and if not available a church member).

- ◆ Oversee use of church facilities and assure that Wedding Policies are adhered to by the Wedding Party and contracted service providers.
- ◆ Oversee the time scheduled for the wedding service, rehearsal, and reception and assure that scheduled time is adhered to by Wedding Party.
- ◆ The Church Wedding Coordinator should do his/her best to consult with the Wedding Party at least 30 days in advance of the wedding.
- ◆ Confirm that payments have been made by Wedding Party to appropriate persons assisting with wedding service.
- ◆ Ensure proper clean up of building by Wedding Party. If cleaning policy is not followed by Wedding Party, deposit will not be refunded.
- ◆ Ensure that the Wedding Party has completed all forms properly and turned them in. All forms and paperwork related to the wedding should be turned into the office no later than 2 weeks following the wedding so that refund can be distributed in a timely manner.

4. Minister Performing Ceremony

- ◆ Must be a Minister of Pleasant Grove Baptist Church or a Minister of like faith (a church in agreement with our interpretation of Biblical guidelines for marriage). Any guest minister must be approved by the Senior Minister of Pleasant Grove.
- ◆ In unusual circumstances where a minister is requested of another faith the minister may take part if the Senior Minister of Pleasant Grove Baptist Church approves.
- ◆ Pastor must be scheduled prior to securing the wedding date on the church calendar to assure availability.
- ◆ Weddings will be conducted in accordance with Biblical guidelines and the state law. Refer to the Biblical guideline provided for further understanding. See Section 21.
- ◆ A signed copy of the Church Covenant between Pleasant Grove Baptist Church and the Minister(s) is due to the Church Wedding Coordinator no later than 30 days prior to the Wedding Date. It is the responsibility of the Wedding Party to have the minister review and sign this covenant and return it to the Church Wedding Coordinator.

5. Marriage Preparation Workshops

- ◆ All persons getting married at Pleasant Grove Baptist Church are expected to attend counseling sessions prior to the Wedding Date.
- ◆ Sessions are conducted by the minister conducting the wedding.
- ◆ The church office can be contacted in order to set up counseling dates with the Senior Pastor of Pleasant Grove if he is performing the ceremony.
- ◆ Sessions are approximately 1 and one-half hours each. All materials are supplied.
- ◆ All sessions must be completed 2 weeks prior to the wedding. In the event the classes are not completed, Pleasant Grove Baptist Church holds the right to cancel the wedding.
- ◆ Couples will be required to sign a marriage covenant at the completion of the sessions with the Senior Pastor of Pleasant Grove Baptist Church. (Refer to Section 19)

6. Wedding Music

- ◆ Keep in mind that a church wedding is a worship service.
- ◆ Music should be in accordance with the reverence that is observed upon entering the House of the Lord.
- ◆ Church musicians are available to be hired and should be contacted as soon as the wedding is scheduled.
- ◆ All music and musicians used in Wedding Service must be approved by the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church Minister of Music. See Section 20 for the listing of your requested music to be

given to the Music Minister for review and indication of approval with signature as well as suggested music.

- ◆ Recorded music and video presentations must be approved by the Pleasant Grove Minister of Music no later than 2 weeks prior to the wedding. The request form should be completed and turned into the Church Wedding Coordinator for consultation with the Music Minister.
- ◆ It is suggested that silk flowers be used due to sensitivity to pollen that many soloists experience.
- ◆ Arrangements of live music to be played at the reception (if held at Pleasant Grove) must also be approved by the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church Minister of Music.
- ◆ The Wedding Party is required to sign and return policy form to the Church Wedding Coordinator no later than 2 weeks prior to the wedding date ensuring the guidelines are understood by the Soloists and Musicians.

7. Dressing Rooms

- ◆ Facilities are provided so that the Wedding Party may dress at the church.
- ◆ Dressing Rooms are provided 3 hours before the wedding time or as agreed upon by the Wedding Party and Church Wedding Coordinator.
- ◆ It is the responsibility of the Bride and Groom to arrange for the care and transportation of personal items belonging to the wedding party before, during and after the wedding.
- ◆ The Dressing Rooms need to be cleared out as soon as possible following the wedding.
- ◆ ***Pleasant Grove Baptist Church is not responsible for lost or stolen items before, during, and after the rehearsal and/or wedding.***

8. Photographers and Videographers

- ◆ It is the responsibility of the bride to instruct the photographer and family that no flash pictures are permissible in the Sanctuary or Chapel once the ceremony begins. The Church Wedding Coordinator should inform and make sure the wedding party understands this guideline.
- ◆ Any special requests must be approved by the Senior Minister of Pleasant Grove.
- ◆ Pictures of Bride entering and leaving are accepted if the photographer is no further than 5 pews from the rear of the church.
- ◆ Photography should be done as discreetly as possible and not be a distraction at any time during the Wedding Service.
- ◆ A time exposure and/or videotaping of the ceremony may be taken from the balcony, or videotaping may be taken from a tripod or setting from the choir loft. The video taken from the choir loft should be unmanned.
- ◆ Only hand held cameras may be used on the first floor of the sanctuary.
- ◆ Photographs may be taken of the Bride's Party and the Groom's Party in the Sanctuary no more than two hours prior to the start of the service nor later than thirty minutes prior to the service.
- ◆ No flash photography may be used during the service except upon the bride's entrance to the sanctuary and the married couple's exit at the end of the service.
- ◆ No extension cords may be used in the foyer or back of church, or on the floor of the sanctuary where there are guests entering and exiting the Sanctuary.
- ◆ Due to limited space, no production equipment (monitors, switches, etc.) are permitted in the foyer area or back of the church.
- ◆ While ceremony is in progress, the foyer doors must remain closed to block out street and foyer noises.
- ◆ Informal pictures before the ceremony of the wedding party may be taken in the dressing rooms and as they move to the sanctuary keeping in mind that the bride and bridesmaids should be in place 15 minutes prior to the ceremony.
- ◆ If the church is providing sound and you wish to use a wireless microphone, you must check the frequency with the Church Audio Technician.
- ◆ Photographers and their employees must refrain from the use of irreverent language, discourteous actions or from smoking inside the church building.

- ◆ Please be considerate of others and keep to the scheduled time frame that can be obtained from the Church Wedding Coordinator.
- ◆ Following the wedding service the wedding party may return for pictures and flash equipment may be used at that time and also during the reception (if held at the church).
- ◆ Out of consideration for the guests, the wedding party and other scheduled events, it is suggested that the taking of pictures following the ceremony be concluded within 30 minutes.
- ◆ Church lights are preset for the beauty of the wedding service at the Bride's request and are not dictated by the needs of the photographer.
- ◆ The Wedding Party is required to sign and return policy form to the Church Wedding Coordinator no later than 2 weeks prior to the wedding date ensuring the guidelines are understood by the Photographer and Videographer.

9. Sound System

- ◆ Church Audio Technician are available for hire. The Audio technician will arrive approximately one hour before the ceremony is to begin and also be present for the wedding rehearsal.
- ◆ Musicians are permitted to have a short rehearsal after the Audio Technician arrives.
- ◆ Rehearsals should be completed 30 minutes prior to the beginning of the wedding.
- ◆ A personal audio technician may be requested; however, the Church Audio Technician must fully train the requested person and be present during all rehearsals and the ceremony. Church equipment may not be used without the presence of the Church Audio Technician.
- ◆ Audio Technician will equip the minister and soloists with microphones.
- ◆ The Church Audio Technician will turn off carillons prior to the wedding and restart after the wedding.
- ◆ Following the rehearsal, the Wedding Consultant will provide the Audio Technician with the number of stands and microphones and their placement needed for the ceremony.
- ◆ Musicians who need to use church sound system are required to contact the church audio technician no later than 2 weeks prior to the service for assistance.
- ◆ The Wedding Party is required to sign and return policy form to the Church Wedding Coordinator no later than 2 weeks prior to the wedding date ensuring the guidelines are understood by personal audio technician if used.

10. Decorations and Florist

- ◆ Pleasant Grove's Sanctuary provides a setting for a dignified and beautiful service and require minimal but carefully planned decorations.
- ◆ Decorating of the church can be done the wedding day between 8:30am and up to 1 hour before the wedding. The church is also available for decorating the day before the wedding during office hours provided no conflicting schedules. The Church Wedding Coordinator or an appointed church member by the Wedding Coordinator must be present at all times when the Wedding Party is present in the church building. See Section 18 for church decorations available for rent.
- ◆ All decorations and floral arrangements must be removed from the church facilities immediately following the wedding ceremony and/or reception.
- ◆ The florist will provide floor coverings for all candelabras that are used during the services and must use dripless candles.
- ◆ An aisle runner must be used whenever flower petals are used. The church aisles are 63 feet long.
- ◆ In order to preserve the beauty of our church facilities, decorations may not be attached to the pews, furniture, or walls by pinning, gluing, taping or nailing.
- ◆ Also we ask that for environmental concerns and animal safety, rice and other non-biodegradable materials not be used. (Balloons let go in the parking lot, etc.)
- ◆ Bubbles may be used outside the church buildings. Confetti, birdseed, flower petals, and rice are not permitted on church property.

- ◆ The Wedding Party is required to sign and return policy form to the Church Wedding Coordinator no later than 2 weeks prior to the wedding date ensuring the guidelines are understood by the Florist.

11. Borrowed or Rental Articles

- ◆ Pleasant Grove has items that may be used for the wedding by approval of the Church Wedding Coordinator. See Item 18 for church decorations available for rent. The Wedding Party is responsible for all items that may be broken or ruined. The Church Wedding Coordinator will inspect all church property and wedding items as they are returned.
- ◆ Arrangements must be made for borrowed articles two weeks in advance and immediately returned to their proper storage following the wedding. Items may not be taken from class rooms or any other location in the church.
- ◆ Storage space is not available for rented or personal items.
- ◆ While every reasonable effort is made to ensure their safety, the church cannot be responsible for accidents or injuries due to the use of borrowed church items.

12. Wedding Receptions and Caterer

- ◆ Church Receptions may be held in the gymnasium or fellowship hall.
- ◆ Arrangements for receptions are to be made with the Church Wedding Consultant who must be present at all church receptions.
- ◆ Outside caterers and/or non-church member Wedding Parties will be expected to provide all supplies; in addition, no cooking or use of commercial kitchen appliances shall be used at any time.
- ◆ In the event church member Wedding Parties request use of commercial kitchen appliances, this will be allowed with an appropriate Food Service Team Supervisor of Pleasant Grove present. It is the responsibility of the Wedding Party to attain the Food Service Supervisor through the Wedding Coordinator for assistance. An honorarium should be provided for the Food Service Supervisor. See Section 18 for suggested honorarium. The Church Wedding Coordinator may provide assistance in attaining the Food Service Supervisor as requested. The Food Service Supervisor must be someone other than the Wedding Coordinator.
- ◆ Church Food Service Supervisor will provide instructions to caterer regarding the clean up after the reception is over through the Church Wedding Coordinator.
- ◆ The kitchen should be left in the same condition as it was found.
- ◆ Decorating of the church can be done the wedding day between 8:30am and up to 1 hour before the wedding. The church is also available for decorating the day before the wedding during office hours provided no conflicting schedules. The Church Wedding Coordinator or an appointed church member must be present at all times when the Wedding Party is present in the church building. See Item 18 for church decorations available for rent.
- ◆ All food and catering items must be removed immediately after the reception.
- ◆ Use of alcoholic beverages or drugs, and dancing are not permitted on the church property. Smoking is allowed in designated areas outside the building.
- ◆ Reception plans will be discussed and cleared with the Church Wedding Coordinator.
- ◆ The Wedding Party is required to sign and return policy form to the Church Wedding Coordinator no later than 2 weeks prior to the wedding date ensuring the guidelines are understood by the Caterer.

13. Cleaning Guidelines

- ◆ It is the responsibility of the Wedding Party to ensure that all areas of the facility are returned as they were prior to the wedding. The Church Wedding Coordinator will be available to oversee and provide directions.
- ◆ Areas included are restrooms and classrooms used by the Wedding Party for dressing as well as restrooms used by guests. The Church Wedding Coordinator can provide assistance with replacing paper products.

- ◆ The Wedding Party is also responsible for cleaning glass of entrance doors at the front of the sanctuary as well as to the gym if a reception is held at the church. The Church Wedding Coordinator can provide cleaning items.

14. The Wedding Party

- ◆ Members of the Wedding Party will recognize that the church is the House of God and will conduct themselves at all times in a manner befitting the atmosphere of a place of worship.
- ◆ Any member of the wedding party who is under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not be permitted to participate in the wedding or remain on church property. It is the wedding party's responsibility to ask a person to kindly remove themselves if at any time these guidelines are broken.
- ◆ In the event that this is not done the Church Wedding Coordinator has the authority to end the reception immediately and ask all parties to vacate the premises in order to ensure that injury or an unfortunate accident does not occur.
- ◆ Pleasant Grove security and/or local authorities may be asked to assist if an unfortunate situation should arise.
- ◆ Use of alcoholic beverages or drugs, and dancing are not permitted on the church property. Smoking is allowed in designated areas outside the building.
- ◆ Appropriate and modest dress is requested for all Wedding Participants and guests.

15. Damages

- ◆ Any damages on the premises before, during or after the Rehearsal, Wedding or Reception will be deducted from the Security Deposit and/or become the responsibility of the Wedding party.

16. The Wedding Contract

I agree to abide by the Church Policies as set forth in the contract and agree to explain policy and guidelines to all whom are assisting with the wedding including but not limited to the photographer, florist/decorators, caterers/receptionists, soloists/musicians, videographer, and/or personal sound technician (if applicable).

19. Marriage Workshop

MARRIAGE PREPARATION WORKSHOP

The Senior Pastor at Pleasant Grove Baptist Church has offered marriage preparation classes for several years and is committed to continuing to provide meaningful opportunities for personal and relational growth as couples prepare for marriage.

The Marriage Preparation Workshops will be presented at a convenient time for both the Minister and the Bride & Groom. It is the couples responsibility to schedule the workshop with the Minister through the church office. Each couple will be expected to attend all three sessions at least 2 weeks before the wedding date. Sessions are approximately 1 and one-half hours each. All materials are supplied.

The three sessions are:

- ◆ Getting to know you
- ◆ The Biblical plan for a healthy marriage
- ◆ Planning the ceremony

In the event that a minister is requested that is not on staff at Pleasant Grove, the workshop will be completed as designed by the officiating minister. If classes are not completed, Pleasant Grove Baptist Church holds the right to cancel the wedding.

- ◆ All music used in the Wedding Service not found on the list provided must be approved by the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church Minister of Music.
- ◆ Music played at the reception or rehearsal must also be approved by the Pleasant Grove Minister of Music
- ◆ Arrangements of live music to be played and musicians at the wedding or reception (if held at Pleasant Grove) must also be approved by the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church Minister of Music.
- ◆ DJ's are outside music entertainers are not allowed unless all music is approved by the Pleasant Grove Minister of Music
- ◆ Church Organist, Pianist and the Music Library have collections of suitable music that may be borrowed. The Wedding Party is responsible for all damaged music, CD's or other audio/music resources that are damaged.
- ◆ Contemporary music is constantly changing so it is helpful to check with a Christian bookstore or music store.

Guest Minister Covenant with PGBC

Pleasant Grove welcomes guest ministers for special occasions. In the past we have realized that many different views and beliefs are held accordingly to scripture. We believe that the minister officiating a wedding at Pleasant Grove should be of like faith. We ask that all guest ministers agree to some basic principles of the Bible in order to accomplish this goal.

The Scriptures

The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is God's revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter. Therefore, all Scripture is totally true and trustworthy.

God

There is one and only one living and true God. He is an intelligent, spiritual, and personal Being, the Creator, Redeemer, Preserver, and Ruler of the universe. God is infinite in holiness and all other perfections. God is all powerful and all knowing; and His perfect knowledge extends to all things, past, present, and future, including the future decisions of His free creatures. To Him we owe the highest love, reverence, and obedience. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being.

Salvation

Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man, and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. In its broadest sense salvation includes regeneration, justification, sanctification, and glorification. There is no salvation apart from personal faith in Jesus Christ as Lord.

Marriage

Marriage is the uniting of one man and one woman in covenant commitment for a lifetime. It is God's unique gift to reveal the union between Christ and His church and to provide for the man and the woman in marriage the framework for intimate companionship, the channel of sexual expression according to biblical standards, and the means for procreation of the human race.
